

SUMMER SCHOOL ON IMAGE PROCESSING (SSIP) 2017, NOVI SAD

SSIP 2017



The **Summer School on Image Processing** aims to provide a stimulating opportunity for graduate and PhD students interested in image processing. The 25th edition will be held between **July 13 and 22, 2017, in Novi Sad, Serbia**, organized by the Chair for Mathematics, Department of Fundamental Disciplines, Faculty of Technical Sciences, University of Novi Sad. Participants will benefit from direct interaction with internationally renowned researchers in various fields of image processing as well as from interacting with participants from all over the world. Students will also have the possibility to present their own research in a short talk. The established tradition of SSIP is that, in addition to morning lectures, students work on a project assignment in international teams, which are then evaluated by a committee of lecturers on the last day. Students will receive a certificate of attending the Summer School and passing the exam, which is recognized as a special PhD course by several universities.

Application: The school is open to about 40 motivated and pre-selected candidates. Graduate and PhD students, post-docs and young researchers (both from academia and industry) are encouraged to apply.

Student Session: SSIP provides the opportunity for participants to present their research in short talks. Please submit your proposal along with your registration.
